Some courses offer additional destinations. Offender Rehabilitation Support Centers provide *Hogoshi* with office space in their communities.

#### Who are *Hogoshi*?

Hogoshi are community volunteers who support rehabilitation and reintegration of offenders on probation in the community. Hogoshi work with professional probation officers to provide offenders with empathetic care, advice, and motivation to lead their lives in the community without reoffending. They also help offenders to secure housing and they engage in crime prevention activities in the community. Hogoshi play an important role in the Japanese offender rehabilitation system.

### What is an Offender Rehabilitation Support Center?

An Offender Rehabilitation Support Center serves as a hub for offender rehabilitation activities in a community. It is mainly used for activities by *Hogoshi*, such as interviewing probationers and parolees.

#### \*1 Kyoto UNRAKUGA-gama kiln



You will also visit the "UNRAKU-gama" kiln, a house of pottery called Kyo-yaki or Kiyomizu-yaki. At the pottery studio, you can see Kiyomizu-yaki's production process.

#### \*2 Houon-ji Temple

The Kamigyo Offender Rehabilitation Support Center is located within the precincts of Houon-ji Temple. After the meeting, *Hogoshi* will escort you to the Temple.
