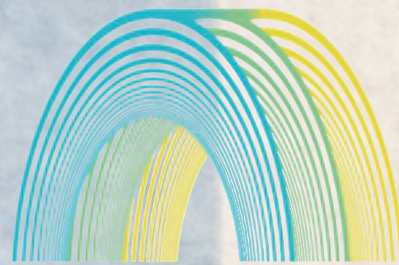

## Program

### WORKSHOP

12 workshop sessions (consists of 45 presentations from 16 countries/areas) are held. Workshop themes include policy and practice of probation, effective assessment and treatment, role of community in offenders' rehabilitation.

### STUDY TOUR (For participants from overseas only)

Participants are invited to visit probation offices, offenders rehabilitation facilities (half way houses), correctional facilities and the homes of volunteer probation officers to see how Japanese system is implemented in practice.

### PLENARY SESSION

Presentations on "Probation, Public Participation and Public Engagement" are given from speakers from Australia, Japan, Kenya, the Netherlands and Thailand. This session will focus on the "good practices" in public participation of each country.
