Page1. 1(2)

Error

The number of processed applications for refugee recognition was 11,361 an increase of 3,168 applicants (about 39%) compared to the previous year. ...9,730 applicants who were not recognized as refugees (hereinafter referred to as “non-recognized applicants”)...

Correct
