


## CREATION OF THE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS DIVISION

In compliance with the TRIPS Agreement (Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights) and Executive Order No. 736, the Philippine Customs issued Customs Administrative Order (CAO) No. 09-2008, creating a permanent office of Intellectual Property Rights.

The Philippine Customs is a member of the National Committee on Intellectual Property Rights.

### **RECORDATION OF IPR**

The Philippine Customs maintains an IPR Registry where IP holders record their IPR. The Philippine Customs monitors and inspects on its own initiative suspect imports to determine whether the shipments are liable under the Republic Act No. 8293.

The application is voluntary and for a fee.

### **RECORDATION OF IPR**

In 2024, the Philippine Customs issued 47 Customs Memorandum Circulars (CMC) with 192 IPR recorded.

In 2025, 56 CMCs were issued from January to August with 150 IPR recorded.

# LARGEST SEIZURE

From 2021 to 2025, the Philippine Customs recorded the highest IPR seizure in 2024. This involves a warehouse located in Manila including knockoffs of globally recognized brands such as Gucci, Louis Vuitton, Chanel, Nike, Rolex, Apple, Hermès, Vans, Dior, Guess and Unregistered Vape Products valued at PHP 11 Billion.



#### HOLDING OF THE PHILIPPINE CUSTOMS' 1st INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY SUMMIT



The Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines recognized the Philippine Customs in April 2025 for its efforts in enforcing intellectual property rights (IPR).

The Philippine Customs received a citation for attaining the highest number of seizures in the National Committee on Intellectual Property Rights (NCIPR) in 2024 during the Gawad Yamang Isip Awards 2025.

In 2024, the Philippine Customs recorded PHP34.698 billion in seizures, making it the leading contributor to the overall confiscation of IPR-infringing goods. The amount represented 85 percent of the total PHP40.99 billion seized by NCIPR.



### **CHALLENGES**

The Philippine Customs faces challenges in IPR protection due to the rapid growth of e-commerce, coordination issues between various enforcement bodies, and a lack of personnel with IPR expertise in ports of entry, among others.
