Legislation & Regulation

- COPYRIGHT ACT B.E. 2537 (1994)
- TRADEMARK ACT B.E. 2534 (1991)
- EXPORT AND IMPORT OF GOODS ACT B.E. 2522 (1979)
- Notification of the Ministry of Commerce on the Determination of Counterfeit Goods and Pirated Goods as Goods Prohibited from Export, Import and Bringing in Transit B.E. 2565 (2022)

Violations under these laws are criminal offenses



Legislation & Regulation

- EXPORT AND IMPORT OF GOODS ACT B.E. 2522 (1979)
- Notification of the Ministry of Commerce on the Determination of Counterfeit Goods and Pirated Goods as Goods Prohibited from Export, Import and Bringing in Transit B.E. 2565 (2022)

Goods infringing trademarks and copyrights are prohibited from import, export and transit.

Customs Notification No. 106/2565 (2022) on the Export, Import, and Transit of Trademark and Copyright Infringing Goods



- · Customs Recordation
- Customs Intervention Without Recordation

Thai Customs Recordation System (TCIRs)

Reasonable suspicion that the goods may infringe Trademarks and Copyright.

Step

Check suspected infringing goods via the TCIRs system.

Step

Notify the suspension to the importer, exporter and rights holder.

Step 3


The importer admitting or silent



Record the seizure and refer the case.



Notify the rights holder in writing, on receiving an objection.





Release goods.

Rights holders submit rights confirmation within 3 days (extendable to 10)

Thai Customs Recordation System (TCIRs)

If the system data is insufficient?

Issue a written notice to the Right holders




• If inspection is requested, submit an application within 24 hours of notification.



• If no request is received within 24 hours, release the goods as usual.

Customs Intervention Without Recordation

When the trademark or copyright owner, or their representative, requests an inspection Seize and notify in writing to:



The importer, exporter, transit agent, or representative

If the requester fails to inspect within 24 hours,



Record the reason in the request and release the goods.

OBJECTION OR APPEAL

If importer objects, file within 3 days; then record and refer the case.

UNABLE TO DETERMINE



the requester may ask to take product samples.
