Opening Remarks by MARUYAMA Hideharu, the Commissioner of the Immigration Services Agency of Japan for the 4th Tokyo Immigration Forum

Your Excellency, distinguished delegates, ladies and gentlemen,

Furthermore, Ms. Ruvendrini Menikdiwela, Assistant High Commissioner for Protection of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) will give a speech.

On the final day, in the morning, we will have a tour of Haneda Airport and hold a seminar on "Countermeasures against Falsified and Altered Documents," where we will introduce the immigration control measures being implemented in Japan.
